


## Reaching IUP: Internationals

Manoj, a committed Christian from India found fellowship at IUP and introduced me to many of his non-Christians friends. We met at the Thanksgiving Dinner Cru planned for International students to explain the holiday and why we as Christians are so thankful. Of about 700 total international students, about 200 showed up! I sat with a table of MBA students from India – half

were Hindi, half were Christians, one was Manoj. He is allowing me

to build relationships with the other 39 Indians who came to IUP together. Pray that this leads to more fruitful discussions and saved souls!

## Reaching IUP: What Worldview?



In two days Mark got into easily 30 spiritual conversations which, in several cases lead to the gospel. While discipling him this past semester I taught him how to use one of Cru's latest evangelistic tools, the Perspective cards, a deck of cards designed to pinpoint another person's worldview. They allow the user to skip the small talk and jump straight to a spiritual

topic. The day after learning to use them Mark's heart for people and curiosity about worldviews drove him to use these to share Christ with as many people as he could; he hasn't stopped yet!

#### Pitt Johnstown: Rekindling

This will be a tremendous growing experience for him; pray that God will use Robert in the years to come to further His kingdom wherever he goes.

#### Going to the World: Venezuela

Recently, I was asked to lead an International Summer Project to Maracaibo, Venezuela. I was honored, but sought the Lord first. Venezuela is a place of unbelievable openness to the gospel; literally hundreds of people accept Christ every summer! There is, however, a serious deficiency of godly fathers and male role models. Many men come to Christ, but find very few men to mentor them.

In 2 Timothy 2:2 Paul reminds
Timothy of the importance of mentoring those younger in the faith.
While speaking at a church on this very topic, I realized right in the middle I'd been challenged to do this very thing in Venezuela! I and co-leader, Stephanie, will be taking 8-12 students with us in hopes of

reaching and raising up some solid consistent student leaders for the movement.

With this great honor comes great responsibility. Providing spiritual leadership for our student team will require much planning on me and Stephanie's part.

It will also require quite a bit of additional funding as airfare into the country is unusually expensive and the living and ministry expenses incountry will be sizeable.

Would you consider giving \$50, \$100 or \$200 (or any other amount) to help me reach Venezuelan students with the gospel?\* For 6 weeks the total cost is over \$5,000!
